Projects with these purposes are requested:

- 1. Engage the community as partners and participants, fostering cooperation between communities of faith, civic, scientific, and educational organizations;
- Further faith formation and liturgical expressions to deepen the theological understanding of the sin of environmental racism, and theological responses to the climate emergency, including climate grief.
- Emerge from and/or partner with groups and/or regions that are vulnerable to environmental racism and climate change;
- · Project leadership reflects a diversity of experiences and backgrounds;
- Demonstrate innovation and creativity; can be used as models for communities in different contexts;
   Promote churchwide learning, understanding, storytelling, and practical application;
- Connect aspects of the project to General Convention mandates as expressed through The Episcopal Church's Vision for Creation Care.
- Projects that engage with health or the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic from an environmental
  justice perspective.
