Minutes of November 13, 2023

Meeting came to order at 1:03 pm ET.

A. Jerry Cappel opened our meeting with prayer.

B. Several announcements were made concerning upcoming events including: The seminar on Deep Green Faith to be held November 30th 6:30 pm, The Province 5 gathering to take place in April, and the United Nations Global Conference #28 with a November 27th noon Kickoff (all of these can be found on the creation care website for more information). Pam Harris told us about how her Diocese distributed Red Maple plants (at least one to each congregation) and also told of other activities.

C. Guest Phoebe Chatfield was with us to explain a new Curriculum being distributed by the Episcopal Church, (but not limited to Episcopalians) which is called: LOVE GOD, LOVE GOD"S WORLD. Due to be rolled out in January or February 2024. It is in a nine session small group discussion format connecting Faith, Creation Care and Eco-justice. The curriculum developed from the question – Are we preaching and teaching about creation care and connected issues?

There are 3 main parts:

- 1 What is God's Dream
- 2 Truth Telling
- 3 Restoring the Covenant

Phoebe Chatfield also explained a survey that found 83% of Episcopalians are very concerned about climate change issues but nationally only 37% of folks surveyed were concerned. Also 90% of Episcopalians asked Should we be doing more?

Ms. Chatfield has provided slides from her presentation and they can be found on the Creation Care website. Also a few other teaching and planning documents such as Blessed Tomorrow Climate and Lesson Plans that work (for youth) are also available.

Jill Fahrenholtz told us about Jelly Bean survey to get people to vote for what they think about Climate Change.

Richard Hiskes asked if deeper questions were included in the new curriculum such as: Have we considered what we owe to our children? Are there policy discussions in this material? Someone else asked if there was content on extinction? Answer was yes. Also if any books were needed for understanding the material? None needed, Braided Sweetgrass is quoted where needed.
