1) PRAY

We pray for all those who have a special concern for the after-care of formerly incarcerated people, especially the alumni and staff members of Saint Leonard's Ministries in Chicago.

Life-giving God, hear us.

Since 1954, Saint Leonard's Ministries has provided holistic reentry services to men and women exiting Illinois jails. With access to safe housing, life skills training, behavioral and physical health care, high school courses, workforce development training, and spiritual support, Saint Leonard's residents are empowered to lead whole and fruitful lives.

Founded by Episcopal priest Father James Jones, Chaplain at what is now Chicago's Cook County Jail, Saint Leonard's Ministries recognizes that individuals returning to our community following incarceration face challenges that impede their paths towards stable, productive lives. By creating an environment of dignity, respect, and encouragement, Saint Leonard's Ministries empowers its residents to navigate these challenges. Saint Leonard's recidivism rates average 23% for men and 9% for women, compared to the state average of 45% for men and 36% for women. St. Leonard's holistic services work!

Over its 68 year history, Saint Leonard's Ministries has evolved into a fully integrated health and social service agency that provides more than 350 alumni annually with comprehensive, evidence-based services improving quality of life, stimulating economic opportunity, and decreasing recidivism while reuniting families.
